

## **Regulations of the competition for teachers organized within the international competition High School Business Challenge**

hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations", posted on the website: [www.businessismore.eu](http://www.businessismore.eu)

### § 1

#### Introductory information

1. The main organizer of the competition for teachers organized as part of the international competition High School Business Challenge (hereinafter referred to as the "Competition") is the European Foundation for Enterprise Development, KRS: 0000836387 NIP: 5213894656, with headquarters at ul. Czerniakowska 24/39, 00-714 Warsaw (hereinafter referred to as the "Organizer").
2. The main organizer, in organizing the Competition, cooperates with national co-organizers (hereinafter referred to as "co-organizers"):
  - a. Studenckim Kołem Naukowym Biznesu przy Szkole Głównej Handlowej w Warszawie in Poland,
  - b. Vysoká škola ekonomická v Praze in the Czech Republic,
  - c. Közép-Európa Társaság in Hungary,
  - d. Študentský Parlament NHF, o.z. in Slovakia.
3. The competition is financed from the funds obtained under a grant from the Visegrad Fund, the organizer's own funds and other funds obtained from the partners and sponsors of the Competition.
4. The organization of the Competition is to increase the number of participants and to streamline the process of disseminating information about the international High School Business Challenge competition.

### § 2

#### Organizer's rights and obligations

1. The Organizer's tasks are:
  - a) organization of the Competition in accordance with the provisions of these regulations,
  - b) providing funds necessary for the implementation of the Competition,
  - c) taking care of proper communication with the participants of the Competition and the school environment,
  - d) conducting promotional activities to popularize the Competition,
  - e) supervising the correct conduct of the Competition,
  - f) appointment of the Competition Commission and control of its functioning.
2. The organizer has the right to disqualify a participant who violates the provisions of these Regulations.

### § 3

#### Participants' rights and obligations

1. Participants of the Competition (hereinafter referred to as the "Participant") may be teachers of secondary schools in Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Hungary.
2. Participation in the Competition is voluntary and free of charge.
3. The participant is obliged to:
  - a) read the Competition Regulations and comply with them,
  - b) follow all instructions of the Competition Committee,

- c) providing correct personal data necessary to participate in the competition, and having and presenting a document enabling their confirmation by the Organizer.
4. The participant has the right to appeal against the Organizer's decision in the manner specified in § 6 of the Regulations.

#### § 4

##### The course of the competition

1. The competition consists of one stage.
2. The Contest Winner is the Contestant who scores the most points awarded by the Contest Committee.
3. Points are awarded based on the number of participants in the international High School Business Challenge competition who indicated a given teacher in the recruitment form as the person who encouraged them to take part in the school qualifying rounds.
4. In the case of team entries, each team member is considered to have indicated a teacher nominated by the group leader as recommending person.
5. One point is awarded for each high school student who has indicated a given Participant in the competition for teachers in the enrollment form.
6. In case of equal number of points scored, the winner is the person who achieved the given result in a shorter time.
7. The results of the Competition are announced on the website [www.businessismore.eu](http://www.businessismore.eu).

#### § 5

##### Competition Commission

1. The Competition Committee consists of three people appointed by the Organizer.
2. The task of the Competition Committee is to select the Competition winner on the basis of applications submitted as part of the international High School Business challenge Competition.

#### § 6

##### Appeal procedure

1. An appeal against the decision of the Competition Committee is submitted to the Organizer within 3 (say: three) days (the date of sending the e-mail message is decisive) from the date of publishing the results of the respective stages of the struggle.
2. The organizer examines the appeal and provides a reply as soon as possible, not longer than 7 (say: seven) working days from the date of receipt of the appeal. The answer is given by e-mail.

#### § 7

##### Processing of personal data

1. Each participant, by submitting an application to participate in the Competition, confirms that he has read these Regulations and undertakes to comply with them.
2. The condition for entering the Competition is the Participant's consent to the processing of the student's personal data by the Organizer and the Competition partners. At the same time, the participant acknowledges that:

- a) the administrator of personal data processed as part of the Competition is the European Foundation for Enterprise Development, KRS: 0000836387 NIP: 5213894656, with headquarters at ul. Czerniakowska 24/39, 00-714 Warsaw
- b) personal data will be processed only for the purpose of conducting and documenting the Competition, publishing the results, including announcing them in the media, on the Internet, on the Competition website and for the purposes of necessary reporting based on the consent granted by the Participant
- c) personal data may be made available to: entities cooperating with the European Foundation for Enterprise Development, including its corporate partners, partners of the international competition "High School Business Challenge", other entities which, on the basis of relevant agreements with the European Foundation for Enterprise Development, process personal data, the administrator of which is European Foundation for Enterprise Development.
- d) personal data may be made available to the entities listed in paragraph 2c both for the purpose of conducting and documenting the course of the Competition, publishing the results, including announcing them in the media, on the Internet, on the Competition website, or the necessary reporting, and for promotional and marketing purposes of entities cooperating with the European Foundation for Enterprise Development and partners.
- e) providing data is voluntary, although refusal to provide them is tantamount to the inability to participate in the Competition,
- f) has the right to access their data and correct them,
- g) has the right to object to further processing, and in the case of consent to the processing of data, to its withdrawal. The exercise of the right to withdraw consent does not affect the processing that took place until the consent was withdrawn,
- h) has the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory body for the protection of personal data in Poland,
- i) the participation of the participant in the Competition is tantamount to free consent to the use of his image in the competition materials of an informational or promotional nature and disseminating it for this purpose in the media, including on the website (photos and videos covering the course of the Competition).

## § 8

### Final Provisions

1. Any disputes and claims related to the Competition, which cannot be resolved by agreement of the parties, will be settled by a common court competent for the Organiser's seat.
2. The regulations may be changed by announcing new content on the Organiser's website.
3. In matters not covered by the Regulations, the provisions of law generally applicable in the country being the seat of the Organizer shall apply.
4. The Regulations come into force on the day of the Competition commencement.
5. For the interpretation of the provisions of these Regulations, the English language version shall apply.
